One lady member of our Patient Reference Group is very keen to spread the message that prevention is better than a cure. Here is another one of her tips:

### 'Keeping healthy in the summer sun'

By all means enjoy the sun, but there are 4 things to remember

\*\*Avoid the sun as much as possible when it is strong
Stay in the shade or indoors as much as possible between 11am

**∰Cover up** 

and 3pm

Cover up the body as much as possible when you are out in the sunshine and wear a a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses

Use high-factor sunscreen liberally

You should apply sunscreen of at least sun protection factor (SPF) 15 (SPF 30 for children or people with pale skin)

\*\*And don't forget to drink plenty of water......






